THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

There is a Brazilian proverb used when a visitor is leaving one's home: 'Whoever drinks of this water keeps coming back'. Offering a beverage such as a cup of water or tea to a visitor is a universal gesture of welcome and hospitality.

Today we hear how Jesus invites two of his disciples to 'come and see' where he lives. He welcomes them into his home and they stay with him for the rest of the day, undoubtedly eating and drinking and conversing with him. Jesus' invitation is simple, yet intimate. We don't know where he lived or what his living arrangements were, but we know he wanted his friends to spend time with him and get to know him.

This precious early time with Jesus must have set his friends up for a lifetime of discipleship. We too are invited to 'come and see', to spend time with the Scriptures and in prayer to get to know Jesus. He welcomes us with open arms.

As we reflect on the inviting love of Jesus, we are also encouraged to extend a warm welcome to others in a spirit of friendship. Pope Francis has often spoken of our responsibility, as individuals, communities and church, to welcome everyone - including those who are homeless or who have been forced to leave their home or country. Our welcome is a response to the Lord's supreme commandment to love the other, the stranger, as ourselves. We all have opportunities to do this in our communities.

On 8th December last, Pope Francis declared 2021 to be a 'Year of St Joseph'. He announced this in a pastoral letter 'Patris corde...With a Father's heart'. We feature this letter from the pope and explore how he is asking us to mark the 'Year of St Joseph'. The homily for the Second Sunday of Ordinary time is offered by Fr Denis Browne where Jesus calls both Andrew and Peter to follow him and to 'Come and See' the new life and hope he offers. Reflection for weekend 16th Jan & 17th Jan 2021

Fratelli Tuti: Chapter 6 - (Pope Francis, Dialogue and Friendship in Society)

In this chapter, Pope Francis turns to dialogue and its essential role in creating a new culture of fraternity. Dialogue is a middle path between "selfish indifference" and "violent protest" (198). Society is built on authentic dialogue, which involves respecting the other's viewpoint, but not in a relativistic fashion. Rather, "it must respect the truth of our human dignity and submit to that truth" (207). In envisioning how this might look in a pluralistic society, the pope draws on a favourite image, that of the polyhedron, "whose different sides form a variegated unity, in which 'the whole is greater than the part'" (215). This is lived out in the hard, but joyful, work of encountering those who are different than ourselves. For this we can call on the Holy Spirit for the gift of kindness.
